Organization for Research Promotion



What is the Organization for Research Promotion?

The Organization for Research Promotion was established on April 1st, 2014 to further promote TMU's research activities and enhance its domestic and international presence as a research university. The Organization consists of the Research Strategy Planning Office, which drafts research strategies, and the University Research Administrator Office (URA Office), which conducts integrated and comprehensive research support activities from basic research to industry-academia collaboration and technology transfer.

What is the Research Strategy Planning Office?

To establish research fields with potential to be world's best by effectively using internal resources and enhancing its research presence, the Research Strategy Planning Office engages in drafting research strategies, collaborative research strategies with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government (TMG) and collaborative research strategies with industry and academia as well as supporting research promotion. The Organization takes a top-down approach with the Director taking the initiative in drafting research

strategies. It aims to promptly respond to various types of environmental changes inside TMU and outside.

Since April 2017, TMU Vice President Toru Yoshikawa has served as Director of the Organization for Research Promotion and also as the chief of the Research Strategy Planning Office. He takes leadership in drafting research strategies, while closely working with the division chiefs.

Message from the Director

The mission of the Organization for Research Promotion is to promote a wide range of research, from basic study to applied research, in various fields, while respecting researchers' own ideas. This mission builds on the basic philosophy of Tokyo Metropolitan University - "Pursuing the vision of an ideal human society in a metropolis." The Organization for Research Promotion collaborates with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and plays a role as a think tank of the local government. We also work with businesses, government bodies, non-profit organizations, and others to return the results of the university's intellectual activities to wide areas of society.

We will continue to carry out our unique research promotion activities by making good use of the university's characteristics and strong points. Through such activities, we will try to further increase the university's research capabilities, deepen relations with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government and other bodies in society, and enhance its presence inside and outside Japan. We would appreciate your cooperation and support.

What is the URA Office?

URA, University Research Administrator, which refers to an expert in promoting research activities in universities and research institutes. Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology defines URA as a person who has a certain degree of knowledge about the contents of research and development, raises and manages research funding, and handles and utilizes intellectual properties. Tokyo Metropolitan University established the Organization for Research Promotion in April 2014 to increase its research capabilities and also set up the URA Office, which

promotes the university's research strategies and activities. The URA Office provides comprehensive support for the university's research activities, covering a wide range of duties such as conducting IR (institutional research) on research activities, raising research funding, proposing collaborations with businesses and other external organizations, making contract negotiations, managing research projects, carrying out PR activities on research results, and social contributions (applying research outcomes to practical use or commercial use).



Roles of the URA Office

Research IR, provision of information (information on external funds and research analysis)

The Office contributes to the promotion of research strategies by investigating and analyzing TMU's unique and strong points in research and proactively approaching our researchers. It collects and summarizes competitive research funding information and research policy information from ministry councils and provides them to our researchers via websites or other means.

Partnering with businesses and other entities

We help our researchers conclude research contracts with external organizations such as businesses and government agencies. It serves as a contact point for allowing researchers to conduct research with external bodies smoothly by negotiating and adjusting research period, content, cost, belonging of intellectual properties, etc. from various angles.

Research PR support

We support the preparation of press releases that can attract mass media attention. It also supports researchers' active submissions to EurekAlert! – a news website that transmits science news to a wide range of interested parties internationally.

Support of the formation of research teams and projects

In accordance with the needs of our researchers, we support the formation of new research teams and research projects by facilitating the collaborations and exchanges among internal and external researchers. In collaboration with the University administration, we support the establishment of project management systems, mainly during the launch of projects when researchers are faced with extra burdens.

Support for managing, using and putting into practical and commercial use of intellectual properties

We serve as a mediator between TMU and industry with the aim of creating a virtuous cycle of the creation and utilization of our intellectual properties, while cooperating with intellectual property officers of the Tokyo Metropolitan University Liaison Office. To return research results to society, we promote practical or commercial implementations of research results on a case-by-case basis including providing support for technology transfer to businesses and the establishing of businesses by researchers themselves.

Core Facilities and Service Center (TBD)

TMU has been working on building an operation system and a database necessary for equipment sharing.

Industry-academia collaboration menu

Joint research

Research jointly conducted by TMU researchers and external researchers from businesses or other entities on shared themes using the promising research resources of TMU

Contracted research

Research conducted by TMU researchers under commission by businesses or other external organizations using the promising research resources of TMU

Academic consultation

TMU researchers are paid to provide advice and guidance to businesses or other organizations upon request using their educational, research and technical expertise, thereby supporting the activities of such external organizations.

Specified research contributions

With the primary aim of encouraging research activities at TMU, we accept contributions that specify affiliation or researchers/research content from businesses, legal bodies, educational/research organizations, etc.

Meeting

We ask you in detail about your inquiry, including who does what by when at how much cost. Then, we coordinate various matters necessary for carrying out research.

Working with the Tokyo Metropolitan Government

Making good use of TMU's strength as a public university established by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government (TMG), we actively make proposals that can lead the TMG's measures. To meet various needs of the Government, depending on projects, we establish cross-sectional contact points that support and promote projects across our faculties and graduate schools and

work to solve urban-type problems by gathering the knowledge of research teams consisting of experts. Also, we are strengthening the collaboration with TMG-affiliated organizations

(Tokyo Metropolitan Industrial Technology Research Institute, Tokyo Metropolitan Institute of Medical Science, etc.).

Activities for collaboration

Explanatory meeting on the TMG's programs

Held at TMU. Officers from TMG's relevant departments outline the government's measures and problems to the TMU researchers.

Measure proposal meeting

Held at the TMG Office. In response to the explanatory meeting on TMG's programs, TMU researchers propose measures making good use of their expertise.



Startup research

This is a system where TMU, as a good adviser to the administration of TMG, responds to inquiries and requests from various agencies of the TMG in a timely manner. TMU allocates preliminary research budgets to research topics that have a potential to grow to become collaboration projects with the TMG.
